# 2022 Recharter

There is a new online recharter system for this year.

National has produced a video introduction to the new system and there is a “sandbox” trial version available to your Unit Key 3 starting later this month.

Start your unit member inventory NOW to determine who will be rechartering with your unit.

**Scouters must ensure that their YPT is current and valid through the entire recharter period (1 Jan 22 – 31 Dec 22).**

Scouts and Scouters will need to ensure that their contact information is correct in My.Scouting.org!

**Do NOT pay on-line, the amount calculated by the system will be incorrect!**

# Changes to BSA Vaccination Policy

The BSA encourages all members of the Scouting community to utilize available vaccines that can provide protection in preventing infectious diseases. Based on the recommendations of the CDC (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention), it is the national policy of the BSA that all participants attending events, activities, programs, or camps requiring an Annual Health and Medical Record (AHMR) must be up to date on all the immunizations listed as required below:

## **REQUIRED for everyone:**

Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis (DTaP or Tdap)

Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR) (if born in 1957 or later)

Varicella (VAR) (chicken pox) (if born in 1980 or later)

Polio (IPV)



# Changes to BSA Vaccination Policy

Although not required, the following immunizations are strongly **recommended** by both the BSA and the CDC. Please review your age-appropriate immunization status with your personal health care provider:

COVID-19

Hepatitis A (HepA)

Hepatitis B (HepB)

Pneumonia (Pneumococcus): PVC13 or PPSV23)

Influenza (annually)

Haemophilus Influenza Type B (HIB)

Human Papilloma Virus (HPV)

Meningococcus Conjugate (MenACWY)

Meningococcus Type B (MenB)

Shingles — Zoster recombinant (RZV)



# Changes to BSA Vaccination Policy

An updated Annual Health and Record form (AHMR) reflecting the changes to immunization requirements will be available in December 2021. A valid existing AHMR Part C can continue to be used after 6/1/2022 until it expires, or if you are claiming a medical exemption to immunization.

Documented medical conditions that prevent safe administration of immunizations will be the only exemption to this policy. Using Part C of the AHMR available December 2021, individuals must have their medical professional record and sign their medical exemption during the pre-participation exam. A valid Part C will be required if claiming a medical exemption even for events under 72 hours.

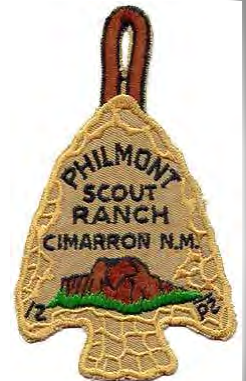

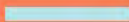

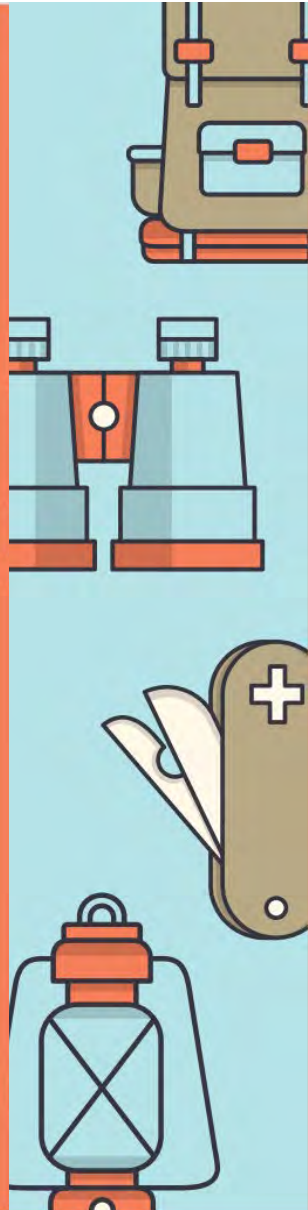

# Climbing Safety - Overview

Young people today seek greater challenges, and climbing and rappelling offer a worthy challenge. While the Climbing merit badge spurs interest in these activities, the proliferation of climbing gyms and facilities has also made climbing and rappelling readily available. Knowing and following the BSA's guidance will help units execute a fun and safe activity for all.



# General Guidelines

## Follow all youth protection policies!

- Climb On Safely is the Boy Scouts of America's procedure for organizing BSA climbing/rappelling activities. Here are the basics:
- Qualified Supervision: A mature adult at least 21 years of age who understands the risks of climbing is needed. Additionally, one adult supervisor is required for every 10 participants. Ensure someone in the group is currently trained in first aid and CPR.
- Qualified Instructors: A minimum of two instructors is needed, but more may be necessary to keep a 6-to-1 ratio of participants to instructors.



# General Guidelines

- **Physical Fitness:** All participants are required to have an Annual Health and Medical Record to show evidence of fitness.
- **Safe Area:** Use an established climbing/rappelling site or facility. Survey the site in advance for possible hazards and ensure it can accommodate the number of participants.
- **Equipment:** Verify proper equipment is available and meets requirements outlined in [Belay On](#).
- **Planning:** Share your plans, secure any permits or permissions for venues/sites, obtain weather reports, and have emergency plans in place.



# General Guidelines

- **Environmental Conditions:** Monitor potentially dangerous conditions like loose, crumbly rock; poisonous plants; wildlife; and inclement weather.
- **Discipline:** All participants should respect and follow all instructions and rules. Learn and present the rules prior to the outing.

## **CHALLENGE BY CHOICE**

- Practice Challenge by Choice, a concept that allows individuals to choose the level at which they want to participate in the various climbing activities without being pressured or coerced by the group and without having to justify their choice.



# Safety Checks

- **Clothing:** No baggy clothing, jewelry removed, and long hair tucked in
- **Harness/Helmets:** Properly fitted helmets; belay and buckles attached per manufacturer
- **Environment:** Program areas free from obstructions; people on ground in safe location
- **Connections:** Belay system connections and all rigging checked and rechecked
- **Knots:** Properly tied, dressed, and backed up with a safety knot
