Recharter 2022 Updates

The Internet Recharter 2.0 software opened on Sunday 2 Oct 22. Access is limited to unit Key 3 and Key 3 Delegates. Make sure that your current Key 3 are registered in [MyScouting.org](https://www.myscouting.org) and you designate your Key 3 Delegates responsible for recharter processing prior to opening the software

Once you have submitted your completed unit recharter on-line, your unit information in [MyScout.org](https://www.myscout.org) is locked until National processes all unit recharter starting on 1 Jan 23. That means that you will be unable to add new Scouts or Scouters and also unable to add Scout rank advancements.

In discussion with the Council Registrar, we will not be processing completed unit recharter until 2 Dec 22.

The recommended form of recharter payment is EFT. There is a \$1.00 service fee for this process. You may use a credit card, but there is a higher percentage fee charged.

Only units using financial assistance **MUST** pay by check. We will need to manually recalculate the correct amount due once you have submitted the necessary applications for financial assistance. You will need to meet with the Commissioner staff at one of the scheduled turn in dates to complete the recharter process



Recharter 2022 Updates

All Cardinal District recharter turn in appointments announced during September's Roundtable for October and November are cancelled.

Safety Moment

Trailer Safety



Safety Moment Summary:

Do you have a troop equipment trailer? If you do, be sure you pay careful attention to the task of properly securing your trailer when not in use to prevent theft. In addition to the cost of the trailer itself, the replacement of troop equipment and sometimes personal items may be several thousand dollars, as well as a major inconvenience if you were about to use the trailer on an outing.



General Information:

Good preventive measures should be employed to discourage theft, but keep in mind that no system can guarantee total protection. Given enough time, resources, and desire, a determined thief can overcome any measures you employ. The goal is to make stealing hard enough that they will go elsewhere!



Optional Security Features (Physical):

Hitch lock: Should go into the ball socket. The hasp should be locked, and safety chains should be removed or padlocked.

Door locks: Rear doors should be locked from inside. Side door handles should be upgraded and backed up by hasp and padlock.

Wheel locks: Use a “boot” type device, which prohibits movement of the tire and wheel. Lug nuts must be covered by the device. And don't be cheap: Lightweight wheel locks can be pried off!

NOTE: All locking devices should be painted a bright contrasting color, so they'll stand out along with anyone moving around them. Make sure all padlocks used are case-hardened and expose as little shank as possible.

Paint: Paint the troop's number on the roof in large numerals, similar to police cars. If for some reason you do not have the trailer's exterior decorated in the easily identifiable Scout manner, paint the tongue, the rear bumper (if there is one), and the wheels orange or red.

Equipment: If possible, don't store equipment in the trailer.



Optional Security Features:

Electronic

Consider using theft detection, surveillance cameras, or an electronic tracking device, if practical.

Location

If possible, store the trailer in a secure yard, fenced and locked with minimal access allowed. When parked put the hitch toward a wall and, if possible, remove the dolly wheel.



Optional Security Features:

Identity

Do not store registration paperwork in the trailer. Remove the license plate when storing; but don't forget to put it back on when hauling the trailer!

Insurance

Before a theft does occur, be sure to check with the insurance carrier for your chartered organization or property owner to see if theft or equipment replacement is covered under the policy.
