D-Day Remembrance Moment

Remembering D-Day and Scouts participation – WW2:

1. Christopher Thomas Adam:

1. Christopher organized a team for his Eagle Scout service project, which resulted in the construction of a permanent D-Day exhibit at the U.S. Army Heritage and Education Center in Carlisle, Pennsylvania.
2. The exhibit, called “Liberation Pointe,” includes full-scale replica bronze statues of two soldiers landing on the beaches of Normandy. It also features eyewitness accounts from three veterans.
3. Completed in 2019 during the 75th anniversary year of the D-Day invasion, Christopher and his team worked for 18 months on this remarkable project. The effort involved nearly \$200,000 in donated labor and materials.

2. Polish Eagle Scouts:

1. Although not directly related to D-Day, it's worth mentioning that Polish Eagle Scouts (partisans and resistance fighters) had been fighting Nazis since 1942.
2. During Operation Tempest, Battalion Zoska (which included Eagle Scouts) captured a Nazi panzer tank and integrated it into their attack plan for Gęsiówka.

3. Scouts and Resistance Fighters:
 1. While not exclusively Eagle Scouts, many young individuals fought bravely during D-Day and throughout World War II.
 2. Their courage and sacrifice, whether as partisans, resistance fighters, or soldiers, contributed to the liberation of Europe and the defeat of Nazi tyranny.

These Scouts and fighters exemplify the spirit of bravery and service during a pivotal moment in history.

The Boy Scouts played a crucial role on the home front during World War II. The Office of War Information (OWI) enlisted them as “Official Dispatch Bearers” to distribute informative and inspirational posters across communities in America.

- [Scouting on the Home Front: They were prepared | Scouts](#)
- Scouts on the Home Front used their skills to support their communities. Adult members and Scout volunteers helped refugees and displaced people during the war.
- They also assisted in various civilian organizations, including the Air Raid Warden's Service, fire departments, and ambulance services. [Scouts worked as fire watchers, stretcher bearers, and messengers, often in dangerous conditions¹](#)
- The members of some Cub Packs and Scout Troops were evacuated on mass, as the programme was organised geographically. Adult volunteers tried their best to keep the Packs and Troops going to offer young people some continuity.

- Branding – takes effect on 8 February 2025



- Combined Troop Pilot
 - Pilot program to allow Troops to have patrols of boys and patrols of girls in the same Troop
 - Awaiting word if Occoneechee will be selected as a pilot Council.



District Commissioner Updates

National Annual Meeting Updates

- Range and Target Activities
 - Effective 6/1 – Cub Scout R&T Activities are now adventures instead of awards
 - Multiple Changes Effective 9/1
 - Firearms programs must occur on Council Range or Commercial Property (except BB's)
 - Use of Personal Firearms and Ammunition is no longer allowed at Council Ranges
 - New Training Course (Range Activity SAFETy Online Training)

- Range and Target Activities
 - Multiple Changes Effective 9/1
 - Changes to allowed rifle calibers for Sea Scouts and Venturing
 - Discontinuation of Hunting Activities in Venturing
 - Unit-Level Pistol Programs are Prohibited – Pistol Programs must be District/Council sponsored
 - Adoption of NRA FIRST Steps Pistol Orientation as the pistol program for Venturing and Sea Scouts

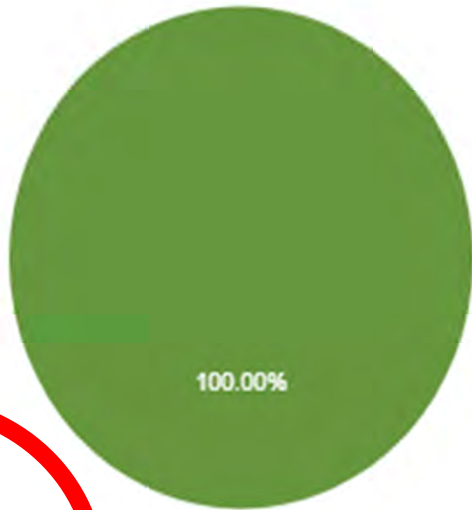

Safety Moment: Annual Health and Medical Record

- ⌘ **Follow BSA transportation guidelines** - all occupants must wear seatbelts, no riding in truck beds, two-deep leadership (no one-on-one during transportation).
- ⌘ **Avoid risky distractions** - electronic devices, drowsiness, eating/drinking, other passengers.
- ⌘ **Identify distracted drivers** - look for drivers drifting from their lanes or driving at inconsistent speeds.
- ⌘ **Stay calm** - don't engage with aggressive drivers, keep your distance.
