District Commissioner Updates

- Guide to Safe Scouting Changes effective 1 September
 - Buddy Trios of mixed genders
 - Same-gendered siblings with over 2-year age gap tenting together with parental approval
 - Scouts with Special Needs tenting with parent
 - Webelos Camping vs AOL Camping
- Range and Target Activities Changes effective 1 September
 - No personal firearms or ammo on camp ranges
 - Troops/Crews/Ships may only use Camp or Commercial ranges – no private property ranges
 - Changes to allowed activities for Crews and Ships



District Commissioner Updates

- 3x3 Unit Concept
 - Unit starts with 3 youth and 3 adults in direct contact positions (no unit Committee)
 - Recommendation is for these to be CRUs, but could be sponsored by a Chartering Org.
 - Unit's goal is to grow into a larger unit – Districts will need support that goal
 - Unit may not set up a bank account without Council approval



Growing Scouting

Announcing a Simpler Way to Get a New Scouting America Unit Started!

Purpose:

The purpose of this approach is to eliminate barriers and streamline our process to starting a new unit (Pack, Troop, Crew or Ship) in a local community. This method can get youth into having fun in Scouting more quickly and without the need for organizing a full unit committee from the starting gate.

Concept:

3 X 3 Unit – Starts with at least 3 youth and 3 adults serving in key roles (Pack: Cubmaster, Den Leader and Assistant Den Leader; Troop: Scoutmaster, Two Assistant Scoutmasters; Crew: Crew Advisor, Two Associate Crew Advisors and Skipper and Two Associate Advisors. It is recommended that these units be started as council registered (but could be sponsored by a charter partner if one is available) and have a goal and the needed support to grow to a larger unit with additional youth and adult leaders.

Safeguarding Youth:

As with any Scouting program all safeguarding measures are to be followed. Including:

- Criminal Background Checks
- Youth Protection Training
- Female Leadership for any unit that has female youth
- Two deep leadership

Benefits:

- Fewer new adults needed to get started.
- Speeds up the process for new members and families.
- Avoid loss of interest during organization phase.
- Get new youth into Scouting faster and on their way to their adventure.
- Works in rural, suburban and inner-city locations.

Other Items:

- Use your council approved volunteers selected and approved by the council board for council-registered units to fill the positions of Council Unit Representative "CUR" and the Executive Officer "IH" positions. There is an option to register with a chartered partner (*additional positions required*).
- A 3x3 unit may not open a bank account without approval of council. In lieu of a bank account a council custodial account can be set up by the council for the unit's financial transactions.
- Since the unit will be formed without a committee, the council (or chartered partner) will need to provide the support a committee would normally perform.

3x3 Start-up Unit Model Sample Backdating Schedule

-28 Days+ – Identify prospects – You need at least 3 excited youth, 3 committed adults and a meeting location.

-28 Days – Complete Paperwork for youth and adults and start adults on youth protection training and position specific training.

-21 Days – Leaders Meeting to plan a calendar, decide if an open Join Scouting event is desired.

-5 Days – Prep for 1st Unit Meeting & Reminder calls to all families about Unit Meeting.

0 Days – 1st Unit Meeting *Let the Adventure Begin!*

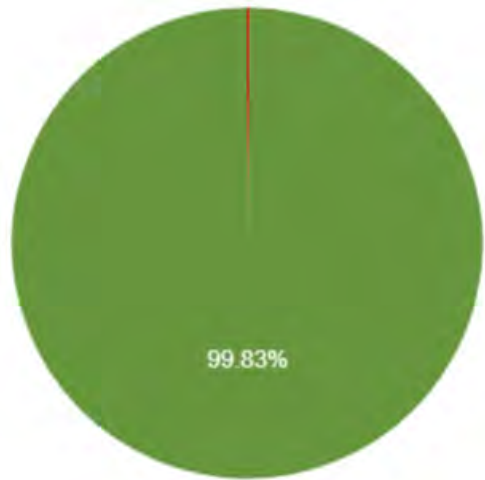

YPT Compliance Monitoring Process

- YPT Aging Status reviewed monthly
- identifying YPT expirations within next 30-60 days
- Unit Notification
 - List of expired participants shared with District Commissioner
 - District Commissioner shares with Unit Commissioner
 - Unit Commissioner shares with unit Key 3

Safety Moment: Camping Accommodations



A parent or legal guardian can share accommodations with their **same-gender child** if the parent/legal guardian meets all leader registration requirements.



Youth siblings **of the same gender** may share sleeping accommodations regardless of age with permission from their parents or legal guardians.



Campsites **must** be arranged to separate genders adequately. Can be achieved through natural barriers, physical distance, or by the campsite being divided, so long as the **separation achieves privacy for both adults and youth, as well as by gender.**

Safety Moment: Buddy System

1+1 = 3

If the original pair for a buddy group is mixed gender, a third youth/participant must be added (for a buddy group of 3).



Youth siblings of the same gender may serve as buddies regardless of age with permission from their parents or legal guardians.



Except for siblings, it is recommended that the age gap between buddies be at most three years for all non-sleeping activities but **must** be no more than two years for all tenting.

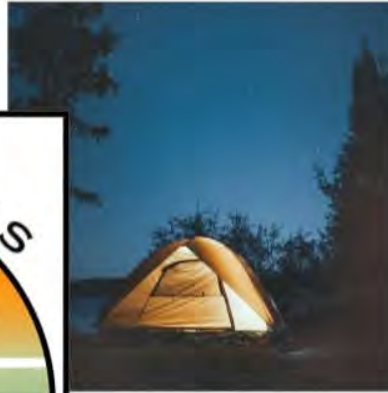

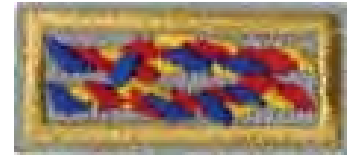

 - 2 Years of Tenure as a registered Adult Leader
 - Completed 'Trained' requirements, one supplemental training, and attended 4 Roundtables or 1 UoS per year
 - Completed Performance Goals during the tenure used

Training Awards

- Scouter's Key – Unit Leader Only (Cubmaster, Scoutmaster, Crew Advisor, Skipper)
 - Three Years of Tenure in a Five Year Period
 - Complete 'Trained' requirements and attend 4 Roundtables or 1 UoS during each year
 - Complete Performance Requirements
- District Committee Members may earn the Scouter Training Award and District Operating Committee Chairs may earn the District Committee Key



General Session

Training Awards

- The previous awards are a miniature medal that can be worn at appropriate events.
- Awards are represented by a patch of a square knot. For the Scouter's Training Award and Scouter's Key, a program device is worn to indicate the program where the award was earned.
- Progress Record Forms exist for each award and program. The progress record is signed by the Unit Committee Chair and the District or Council Training Committee Chair
- Signed Progress Record Forms are submitted to the Council for processing.

- Council Alumnus of the Year
 - Scouting Alumni Association's highest Council recognition
 - Recognizes alumni that have used the skills and values of scouting to make significant contributions to the communities through their career, avocations, and Scouting
 - Councils can give out 1 award per year
 - Occoneechee accepts nomination in the fall
 - Presented at Council Business Meeting in January
 - Award is a medal and lapel pin
 - 2024 is the first time Occoneechee will present this award

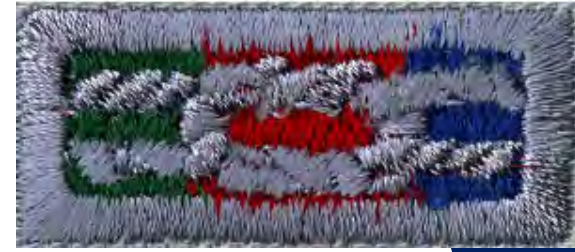
- W.D. Boyce New Unit Organizer Award
 - The unit completes the Progress Record at the time of the first unit renewal
 - The unit nominates volunteers that were instrumental in the creation of the unit
 - The Progress Record and Nomination Form are signed by the District Chair, District Membership Chair, and District Commissioner. The forms are then submitted to the Council for processing



General Session

Nominated Awards

- Venturing Leadership Award and Sea Scout Leadership Award
 - A nomination form is submitted to the Council VOA or Council Quarterdeck for review
 - Award is open to youth/participants and adults, but there cannot be more adult recipients than youth recipients
 - Councils may only review and select award recipients once per year
 - Nomination deadlines are set by the Council VOA and Council Quarterdeck

- Community Organization Award
 - Several National Chartered Organizations have developed recognitions that indicate a volunteer has supported their cause and the Scouting community.
