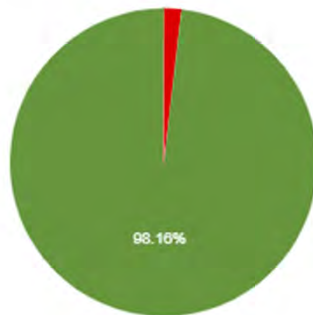

- YPT Aging Status reviewed monthly – identifying YPT expirations within the next 30-60 days
- Unit Notification
 1. List of expired participants shared with the District Commissioner
 2. District Commissioner shares with Unit Commissioner
 3. Unit Commissioner shares with unit Key 3

Safety Moment: Medication Use

While medication responsibility lies with the individual or their guardian, good planning and awareness help ensure youth stay safe and healthy. Scouting America recognizes that leaders may not know every health issue, making preparedness essential.



AHMR (Annual Health and Medical Record). A completed AHMR provides leaders and providers with essential information for emergency treatment. All medications must be listed on the form.



PLAN. If a leader will manage a youth's medication during an event, a medication plan should be in place.



SUPERVISION. The plan should clearly define who will assist the youth with medications, especially if they cannot self-administer or need special care.



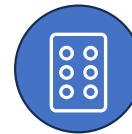
LABELING. Medications must be accurately labeled to prevent errors.



STORAGE. Plan for proper storage of high-risk medications, including those needing refrigeration.



EMERGENCY MEDICATION. Ensure youth with inhalers or epinephrine auto-injectors have access, know how to use them, and report usage to an adult.



NONPRESCRIPTION MEDICATIONS. Provide clear guidelines for any over-the-counter medications given by leaders or kept by youth.



ACCOUNTABILITY. While not required, keeping documentation of stored medications is a best practice.

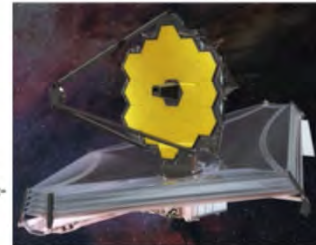

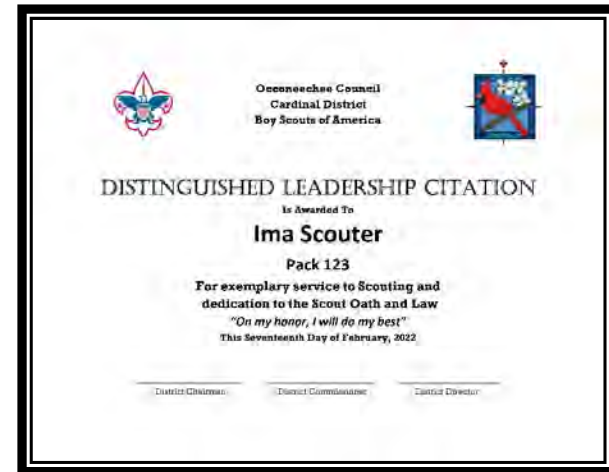

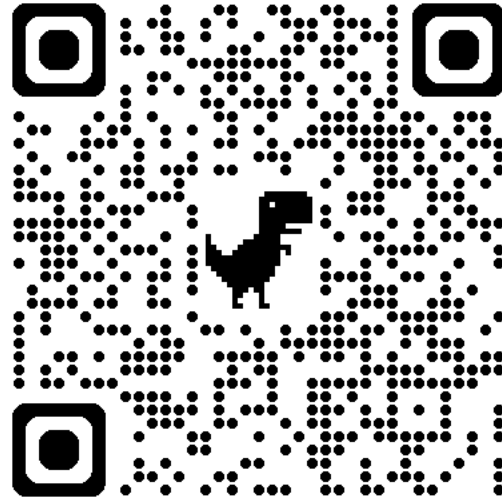
